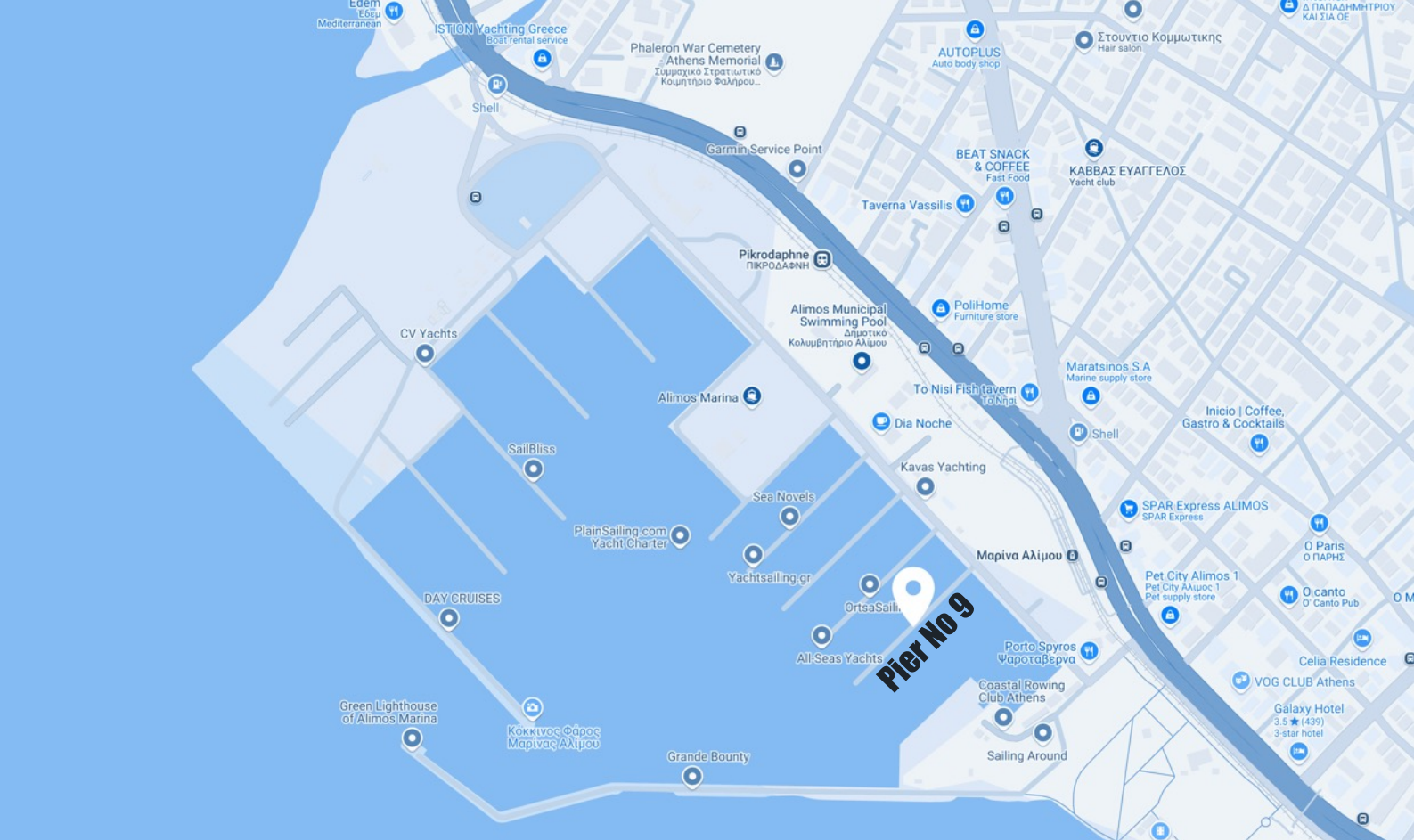

ALIMOS MARINA (KALAMAKI)

Pier 9 (914-927) Catamaran Marmar

ARRIVAL IN ATHENS

- ✓ Upon arrival at Athens International Airport, you may take one of the taxis waiting at the entrance. The meeting point is Marina Alimos, which is approximately 40 minutes away by taxi.
- ✓ At the marina, proceed to Pier No. 9, where the catamaran Lagoon 450 Marmar is moored between positions 914 and 927.
- ✓ The crew will warmly welcome you on board.
- ✓ Please ensure you arrive at the catamaran no later than 2:30 PM.
- ✓ The crew cannot accommodate late arrivals, as the catamaran must reach Aegina before nightfall.
- ✓ Any additional costs incurred due to delays or other unforeseen circumstances will require you to arrange and pay for your own transfer to the catamaran.
- ✓ Lunch will be served on board on the first day, while dinner at the first port (Poros) will be at your own expense.
- ✓ On the final day of your cruise, disembarkation is scheduled for 9:00 AM, following breakfast.

- ✓ A soft-shell suitcase or travel bag. Hard shell luggage won't fit in your cabin.
- ✓ Sunglasses
- ✓ Hat or cap
- ✓ A light sweater for chilly evenings
- ✓ Sunscreen and sunburn-soothing lotion
- ✓ Sea sickness medication
- ✓ Your camera
- ✓ Your passport
- ✓ 400€ in cash per cabin for the cash box to hand to the skipper upon arrival and 10% of the amount of the cruise for tips.
